South Dakota Mines Announces 2024 Community Champions (Surprise: One is a BHC member!)

South Dakota Mines recognized local business Pancheros Mexican Grill and business leader and alumnus Tyler Artz (and Black Hills Chapter member) as the 2024 Community Champions during the annual state of the university address.

This is the second year for the award, which recognizes a local community member, business, or organization that has dedicated time, treasure, and talent to further the university's mission.

Michael Dowding, senior lecturer in the Mines physics department, nominated Artz for the honor and said his presence on campus is as strong as it was when he was a student. "His love of the school and commitment to our community keeps bringing him back to campus and helping to integrate our faculty, staff and students with local businesses and the community at large," Dowding said. "He is truly a face of our community and makes our campus and Rapid City a great place to be."

Artz graduated from Mines in 2015 with a bachelor's in mining engineering and management and, in 2016, with a master's in mining engineering. He is a business development manager and paraplanner for Dakota Summit Financial Advisors, a financial advisory practice of Ameriprise Financial Services, LLC.

"South Dakota Mines assisted in the development of who I am. I never want to lose my connection with Mines and hope to continue to be a good steward for the university," Artz said. "I made a lot of friends while attending Mines that I still connect with, and it helped me find careers in the Black Hills, making it my

Additional Safety Reminders

Reminders from the MSHA website, with a few additional thoughts.

DRILLING

NEVER drill into explosive materials or into any hole that has contained explosive materials.

It is critical the responsible person laying out the drill pattern ensure the area has been properly prepared. Preparation usually consists of cleaning off material from the bench above to get down to grade or a hard surface. During this process the area needs to be inspected for any remaining blastholes. Inspection of any blastholes to ensure there are no explosive material from a prior blast event. One solution for inspection may be to use a water truck to help wash out rocks or material from a hole to ensure the hole is clean. Once the area has been prepared (cleaned and graded) then a new drill pattern may be laid out. Ensure that future drill holes are offset from a previous blast pattern so that we are not asking a drill operator to place a new hole directly where a previous hole ended. The distance a new drill hole should be from a previous blast hole should be clearly worded within the site-specific Drill and Blast SOP.

LOADING

ALWAYS check holes for proper depth or obstructions before bringing explosive materials to the blast site.

ALWAYS make sure the blast area is clear before loading a blast holes.

ALWAYS continually check the weather around the blast site for storms and lightning.

ALWAYS follow proper procedures when making up primers.

NEVER prepare primers until right before placing them in the boreholes.

NEVER use electric blasting caps during dust, snow, or electrical storms.

ALWAYS stop blasting operations if a storm is in the area.

NEVER force explosive materials into blocked boreholes.

ALWAYS be alert for holes that have voids or open bottoms.

ALWAYS use care when loading boreholes to minimize the potential of damaging insulation on leg wires.

NEVER let connections touch the ground.

NEVER use splices in boreholes.

NEVER use tamping tools that may generate sparks, heat, or electrical current.

NEVER load boreholes near electric power lines if there is any possibility that leg wires could contact power lines.

NEVER run equipment over loaded boreholes.

NEVER use electric blasting caps near radio transmitters or any source of static electricity.
